THE INVOCATION *and* **GATHERING PRAYER**

P: We gather under the sign of the cross, and in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS OF SIN

C: Amen.

P: If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

P: Most Merciful God,

CHILDREN'S SERMON

FIRST READING: Lamentations 3:22-33

Jeremiah proclaimed that the Lord's steadfast love never ends. His mercies are new every morning. It is good to wait for the Lord, even in the face of those who insult and persecute us.

²²The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; ²³they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. ²⁴"The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in him." ²⁵The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him. ²⁶It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord. ²⁷It is good for a man that he bear the yoke in his youth. ²⁸Let him sit alone in silence when it is laid on

him; ²⁹let him put his mouth in the dust—there may yet be hope; ³⁰let him give his cheek to the one who strikes, and let him be filled with insults. ³¹For the Lord will not cast off forever, ³²but, though he cause grief, he will have compassion according to the abundance of his steadfast love; ³³for he does not afflict from his heart or grieve the children of men.

R: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

RESPONSIVE READING: Psalm 30

When the psalmist cried to God for help, the Lord did not forsake him or let his enemies get the best of him. David praised the Lord for bringing him out of the place of the dead and restoring his life.

R: I will extol you, O Lord, for you have drawn me up and have not let my foes rejoice over me.

C: O Lord my God, I cried to you for help, and you have healed me.

R: O Lord, you have brought up my soul from Sheol; you restored me to life from among those who go down to the pit.

C: Sing praises to the Lord, O you his saints, and give thanks to his holy name.

R: For his anger is but for a moment, and his favor is for a lifetime. Weeping may tarry for the night, but joy comes with the morning.

C: As for me, I said in my prosperity, "I shall never be moved."

R: By your favor, O Lord, you made my mountain stand strong; you hid your face; I was dismayed.

C: To you, O Lord, I cry, and to the Lord I plead for mercy:

R: "What profit is there in my death, if I go down to the pit? Will the dust praise you? Will it tell of your faithfulness?"

C: Hear, O Lord, and be merciful to me! O Lord, be my helper!"

R: You have turned for me my mourning into dancing; you have loosed my sackcloth and clothed me with gladness,

C: that my glory may sing your praise and not be silent. O Lord my God, I will give thanks to you forever!

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 8:1-9,13-15

St. Paul wrote to the church in Corinth, reminding them that though Jesus was rich in his divinity, he became poor for our sake. Paul lifted up the generosity of the church in Macedonia that was going through great hardship and yet made a donation to the collection for the Jerusalem Christians.

¹We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, ²for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their

extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. ³For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own accord, ⁴begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints—⁵and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us. ⁶Accordingly, we urged Titus that as he had started, so he should complete among you this act of grace. ⁷But as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all earnestness, and in our love for you—see that you excel in this act of grace also. ⁸I say this not as a command, but to prove by the earnestness of others that your love also is genuine. ⁹For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich. ¹³For I do not mean that others should be eased and you burdened, but that as a matter of fairness ¹⁴your abundance at the present time should supply their need, so that their abundance may supply your need, that there may be fairness. ¹⁵As it is written, “Whoever gathered much had nothing left over, and whoever gathered little had no lack.”
