CALL TO WORSHIP

Our service begins by invoking the name of the one who claimed us in Baptism. These opening sentences shift our attention away from ourselves and the distractions of the world onto the one whom we gather to hear from through His precious Word and Sacraments.

C: Blessed are those who hope in God – the one who frees prisoners, gives sight to the blind, and uplifts the fallen.

P: The Lord protects strangers and upholds the orphan and widow; but the way of the wicked is brought to ruin.

C: The Lord our God will reign forever, for all generations. Praise the Lord!

CHILDREN'S SERMON

FIRST READING: Revelation 14:6-7 (ESV)

John described from his apocalyptic vision an angel who flew overhead and delivered a message to the inhabitants of the earth. "Give God the glory!" was the basis of the news that was directed at every tribe and nation.

⁶Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people. ⁷And he said with a loud voice, "Fear God and give him glory, because the hour of his judgment has come, and worship him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water."

R: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

RESPONSIVE READING: Psalm 46 (ESV)

Even in the midst of trial it is God who is a very present help in times of troubles. God is in the center of all life and is the protection for his people. He is a fortress and ruler of all that is.

R: God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

C: Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea,

R: though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling.

C: There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy habitation of the Most High.

R: God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved; God will help her when morning dawns.

C: The nations rage, the kingdoms totter; he utters his voice, the earth melts.

R: The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

C: Come, behold the works of the Lord, how he has brought desolations on the earth.

R: He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the chariots with fire.

C: “Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!”

R: The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress.

R: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28 (ESV)

Paul explained to the Romans that those who are held under the law will be judged by the law as the law points to sin. But those who believe in Christ are made right with God by grace through faith. All this is done apart from the law, for the law kills, but the Gospel saves.

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin. ²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. ²⁷Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

R: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

P: The Holy Gospel according to Saint John, the 8th Chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord!

³¹So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, “If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, ³²and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.” ³³They answered him, “We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, ‘You will become free?’” ³⁴Jesus answered them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. ³⁶So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

P: This is the Gospel of our Lord!
