P: Jesus Christ is God's chosen one, who came and who comes again to call all people to salvation from sin and death. In him, all who are baptized are made sons and daughters of God. Marked by the cleansing and renewing waters of Holy Baptism, let us confess our sin and receive God's promise of forgiveness.

Silence is kept for reflection and self-examination

P: Almighty and merciful God,

C: In Holy Baptism you have marked us with the sign of Christ's cross upon our foreheads and upon our hearts, setting us apart as your chosen people, redeemed by the crucified and risen one. Yet we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed. Forgive us our faults, open our eyes to the freedom of your grace, and renew us in our calling to live as your people in the eternal kingdom. Amen.

P: Upon this your confession, almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given you new birth through water and the Spirit, forgives you all your sins. May God strengthen you by grace and keep you in eternal life.

First Reading | Isaiah 42:1-9

The prophet Isaiah promised that God's Spirit shall bring justice to the nations through his servant Israel. This shall be accomplished not through the means of violence or arrogance, but through steadfast attention to God's ways and faithful guidance. Through Israel, God's light shall be revealed to all nations.

Responsive Reading | Psalm 29

The psalmist extolled the majestic aspects of the Lord and his voice. The voice of the Lord upon the waters is full of glory; it is powerful and full of splendor, making all creation tremble and shake.

January Service Project: Each year, 4.2 million young people experience homelessness in the United States. That reality is especially troubling during Minnesota's cold winter months. Last year alone, the Youth Resource Center in Mankato served 470 youth from our community. Throughout the month of January, Resurrection Lutheran will host a supply drive to support the Youth Resource Center and the young people who rely on its care. You are invited to bring any of the following items: granola or protein bars, scarves/hats/gloves, personal hygiene items (toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, body wash, lotion), kleenex or baby wipes.

Madagascar Health and Water is a clean-water initiative coordinated by Resurrection Lutheran Church member Andry Ranaivoson. With persistent famine causing widespread malnutrition and death throughout much of Madagascar, this ministry works to locate clean water deep beneath the surface and provide remote villages with safe drinking water, sanitation, and agricultural tools. Resurrection Lutheran raised over \$1,800 for this mission in the month of November. To help us learn more about this life-saving ministry, Andry will offer a presentation next Sunday, January 18th at 3:00pm. Pie and coffee will be served.
