## **CHRISTMAS DAY DIALOGUE**

P: To you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

**C: Oh, come, let us adore him!**

P: O Lord, ruler of the ages eternal, you are without beginning or end:

## **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS OF SIN**

P: Blessed be the Holy One of Israel, the Word made flesh, the Power of the Most High – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – one God, now and forever.

**C: Amen.**

P: We give thanks and praise to our Heavenly Father for sending his one and only Son to share our humanity, to carry our guilt, and become for us the perfect Lamb who takes away the sin of the world. Though he was rich, he became poor, that in his poverty we might become rich. Gathered in the name of Christ, let us confess our sin in the presence of God and one another.

*Silence is kept for self-examination and reflection*

P: Gracious God,

**C: in Jesus Christ you came among us as the light shining in the darkness. We confess our sin against you in thought, word, and deed by what we have done and by what we have left undone. Forgive us and renew our hope, that we may trust the light of your face, and welcome the truth of Christ, our Lord. Amen.**

P: People of God, I bring to you good news of great joy: to you is born a Savior, Christ the Lord. As a called and ordained minister of the Church of Christ, and by his authority, I

declare unto you the forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

**C: Amen.**

## **CHILDREN'S SERMON**

**FIRST READING:** Isaiah 52:7-10 (ESV)

<sup>7</sup>How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns."<sup>8</sup>The voice of your watchmen—they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the Lord to Zion. <sup>9</sup>Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem, for the Lord has comforted his people; he has redeemed Jerusalem. <sup>10</sup>The Lord has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations, and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

R: The Word of the Lord.

**C: Thanks be to God!**

**RESPONSIVE READING:** Psalm 2 (ESV)

R: Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain?

**C: The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and against his Anointed, saying,**

R: "Let us burst their bonds apart and cast away their cords from us."

**C: He who sits in the heavens laughs; the Lord holds them in derision.**

R: Then he will speak to them in his wrath, and terrify them in his fury, saying,

**C: "As for me, I have set my King on Zion, my holy hill."**

R: I will tell of the decree: The Lord said to me, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you.

**C: Ask of me, and I will make the nations your heritage, and the**

**ends of the earth your possession.**

R: You shall break them with a rod of iron and dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel."

**C: Now therefore, O kings, be wise; be warned, O rulers of the earth.**

R: Serve the Lord with fear, and rejoice with trembling.

**C: Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who take refuge in him.**

R: The Word of the Lord.

**SECOND READING:** Hebrews 1:1-6 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup>Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, <sup>2</sup>but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. <sup>3</sup>He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, <sup>4</sup>having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. <sup>5</sup>For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"? Or again, "I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son"? <sup>6</sup>And again, when he brings the firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him."

R: The Word of the Lord.

**GOSPEL READING:** John 1:1-14 (ESV)

P: The Holy Gospel according to Saint John, the 1<sup>st</sup> Chapter.

**C: Glory to you, O Lord!**

<sup>1</sup>In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup>He was in the beginning with God. <sup>3</sup>All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. <sup>4</sup>In him was life, and the life was the light of men. <sup>5</sup>The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. <sup>6</sup>There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. <sup>7</sup>He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. <sup>8</sup>He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light. <sup>9</sup>The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. <sup>10</sup>He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. <sup>11</sup>He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. <sup>12</sup>But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of

God, <sup>13</sup>who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. <sup>14</sup>And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Members should stop in the narthex this morning to pick up their **January 2023 Newsletter**.






