## **CALL TO WORSHIP**

*Our service begins by invoking the name of the one who claimed us in Baptism. These opening sentences shift our attention away from ourselves and the distractions of the world onto the one whom we gather to hear from through His precious Word and Sacraments.*

P: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

**C: Amen.**

P: Let us call upon the Triune God.

**C: Let us worship the Father, who spoke in the beginning and created something out of nothing.**

P: Let us call upon the Triune God.

**C: Let us worship the Son, who took on the clothing of humanity to set the oppressed and the prisoner free.**

P: Let us call upon the Triune God.

**C: Let us worship the Spirit, who rests continually upon us, calling us to faith in a chaotic and sin darkened world.**

P: Holy Trinity, all that is, all that was, and all that ever will be:

**C: You have shown us your love through the Son. Now guide us into the truth by the gift of your Holy Spirit, so that we may glorify you forever. Amen.**

## **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS OF SIN**

*As an assembly of sinners, we come before God each Sunday morning to admit our faults, failures, and guilt. The word of absolution speaks the Gospel into our ears and assures that because of Christ's death at Calvary, every one of our sins is covered.*

P: Friends in Christ, our heavenly Father has called us to be His people, leading us to green pastures and still waters. Yet, there are times when we have wronged our fellow sheep

and wandered from our Shepherd. But we are not abandoned. Trusting in the goodness of our God and the renewing power of the Holy Spirit within us, let us tell the whole truth about ourselves, confess our sins, and seek God's ceaseless mercy.

*Silence is kept for reflection and self-examination*

P: Loving and forgiving God,

**C: We confess that we are held captive by the power of sin and have gone astray. We have not welcomed the stranger and outsider. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not been Christ to one another. Restore us, O God. Wake us up and turn us from our sin. Renew us each day in the light of Christ. Amen.**

P: People of God, hear this glad news: Jesus Christ has come so that you might have new and abundant life. In his name and by his authority alone, I forgive you all your sins. May you be strengthened in God's love, comforted by Christ's peace, and accompanied with the power of the Holy Spirit.

**C: Amen! Thanks be to God!**

## **CHILDREN'S SERMON**

### **FIRST READING: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31 (ESV)**

*This chapter of Proverbs personifies wisdom as a woman who calls people to listen. This attribute of God existed before the foundations of the earth were laid, before mountains had been shaped and the sea was given limits.*

<sup>1</sup>Does not wisdom call? Does not understanding raise her voice? <sup>2</sup>On the heights beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; <sup>3</sup>beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries aloud: <sup>4</sup>“To you, O men, I call, and my cry is to the children of man. <sup>22</sup>“The Lord possessed me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of old. <sup>23</sup>Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. <sup>24</sup>When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. <sup>25</sup>Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, <sup>26</sup>before he had made the earth with its fields, or the first of the dust of the world. <sup>27</sup>When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, <sup>28</sup>when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, <sup>29</sup>when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, <sup>30</sup>then I was beside him, like a master workman, and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, <sup>31</sup>rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the children of man.

R: The Word of the Lord.

### **RESPONSIVE READING: Psalm 8 (ESV)**

*The psalmist sang praises to the Lord for the majestic creation of the universe. This One who created such majesty is also He who created humankind.*

R: O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens.

**C: Out of the mouth of babies and infants, you have established strength because of your foes, to still the enemy and the avenger.**

R: When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place,

**C: what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?**

R: Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor.

**C: You have given him dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under his feet,**

R: all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field,

**C: the birds of the heavens, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas.**

R: O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

R: The Word of the Lord.

**C: Thanks be to God!**

## **SECOND READING: Acts 2:14a, 22-36 (ESV)**

*Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter preached a sermon that explained the truth about Jesus' identity. Peter told who Jesus was, what he did, and how God raised him from the dead on the third day. This one that they crucified, Peter proclaimed, is living and active.*

<sup>14</sup>But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them: <sup>22</sup>“Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know—<sup>23</sup>this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. <sup>24</sup>God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. <sup>25</sup>For David says concerning him, “‘I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; <sup>26</sup>therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; my flesh also will dwell in hope. <sup>27</sup>For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One see corruption. <sup>28</sup>You have made known to me the paths of life; you will make me full of gladness with your presence.’ <sup>29</sup>“Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. <sup>30</sup>Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, <sup>31</sup>he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. <sup>32</sup>This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. <sup>33</sup>Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. <sup>34</sup>For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says, “‘The Lord said to my Lord, “‘Sit at my right hand, <sup>35</sup>until I make your enemies your footstool.’” <sup>36</sup>Let all the

house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified.”

### GOSPEL READING: John 8:48-59 (ESV)

P: The Holy Gospel according to Saint John, the 8<sup>th</sup> Chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord!

<sup>48</sup>The Jews answered him, “Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?” <sup>49</sup>Jesus answered, “I do not have a demon, but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me. <sup>50</sup>Yet I do not seek my own glory; there is One who seeks it, and he is the judge. <sup>51</sup>Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death.” <sup>52</sup>The Jews said to him, “Now we know that you have a demon! Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet you say, ‘If anyone keeps my word, he will never taste death.’ <sup>53</sup>Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? And the prophets died! Who do you make yourself out to be?” <sup>54</sup>Jesus answered, “If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, of whom you say, ‘He is our God.’ <sup>55</sup>But you have not known him. I

know him. If I were to say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and I keep his word. <sup>56</sup>Your father Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day. He saw it and was glad.” <sup>57</sup>So the Jews said to him, “You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?” <sup>58</sup>Jesus said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am.” <sup>59</sup>So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.
