The season of Advent prepares our hearts to hear the story of the Father sending his Son, Jesus Christ, to redeems us from the powers of sin, death and the devil. The word Advent is from the Latin for "coming into." The season of Advent is a season of hope coming into the world.

IN WORSHIP

The first Sunday of Advent is December 3rd. We will light the Advent wreath each of the four Sundays of the season, marking the passing of time until Christmas, as our anticipation mounts for the coming Christ child. Sign-up sheets are available in the narthex for individuals, couples or families wanting to read the wreath lighting liturgy during worship.

MIDWEEK SERVICES

Midweek Advent soup suppers will be held in the fellowship hall on Wednesdays December 6th, 13th, and 20th starting at 6:15pm. A worship service will follow each of those meals in the Fireside Room Chapel at 7:00pm. Sign-up sheets are available in the narthex for those wishing to bring soup, bread and dessert each week.
