

Confession and Forgiveness of Sin | Based on Ephesians 3:12 and Psalm 72:11

P: In Christ, we have boldness and access with confidence through our faith in him.

C: May all kings fall down before him, all nations serve him!

P: In repentant faith, we come before our Lord in confession.

Silence is kept for reflection and self-examination

P: Almighty God, King of all,

C: we confess to you that we are sinful by nature. We have lived in darkness rather than light. Our selfish thoughts, harmful words, and faithless actions reveal our sinfulness. But for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, who became flesh for us, we pray, forgive us our sins. Amen.

P: God's grace is revealed in the birth, life, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. He has brought light to this world darkened by sin. In the stead and by the command of Jesus, I announce to you the full forgiveness of all of your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Children's Sermon

First Reading | Isaiah 60:1-6

Pew Bible Pg. 718

The prophet said that Israel will rise out of the darkness of their exile as the glory of the Lord has risen upon them. No longer will darkness be their reality; radiant light will cover them as exiles return home to Jerusalem and families are reunited.

Responsive Reading | Psalm 72:1-11

The psalmist prayed for wisdom and discernment for the king so that he might rule the people in righteousness, look out for the poor and needy, and punish cruel tyrants. This king is empathetic with his people. When they suffer, he suffers.

R: Give the king your justice, O God, and your righteousness to the royal son!

C: May he judge your people with righteousness, and your poor with justice!

R: Let the mountains bear prosperity for the people, and the hills, in righteousness!

C: May he defend the cause of the poor of the people, give deliverance to the children of the needy, and crush the oppressor!

R: May they fear you while the sun endures, and as long as the moon, throughout all generations!

C: May he be like rain that falls on the mown grass, like showers that water the earth!

R: In his days may the righteous flourish, and peace abound, till the moon be no more!

C: May he have dominion from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth!

Paul explained the mystery of Christ that was unknown to people before Jesus — that the Gentiles are fellow heirs of the promises of God. The promises of Jesus Christ are extended to all nations through the saving Gospel, and those who were once strangers are now fellow members of the body.

The Nicene Creed

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: And also with you.

P: God has made us his people through our Baptism into Christ. Living together in this peace and in community with one another, let us confess our faith:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Each petition ends with the words “Lord, in your mercy.” Respond by saying, “Hear our prayer.”

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us, not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

January Service Project: Each year, 4.2 million young people experience homelessness in the United States. That reality is especially troubling during Minnesota's cold winter months. Last year alone, the Youth Resource Center in Mankato served 470 youth from our community. Beginning this morning and running throughout the month of January, Resurrection Lutheran will host a supply drive to support the Youth Resource Center and the young people who rely on its care. You are invited to bring any of the following items during the month: granola or protein bars, scarves/hats/gloves, personal hygiene items (toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, body wash, lotion), kleenex or baby wipes.

Madagascar Health and Water is a clean-water initiative coordinated by Resurrection Lutheran Church member Andry Ranaivoson. With persistent famine causing widespread malnutrition and death throughout much of Madagascar, this ministry works to locate clean water deep beneath the surface and provide remote villages with safe drinking water, sanitation, and agricultural tools. Resurrection Lutheran raised over \$1,800 for this mission in the month of November. To help us learn more about this life-saving ministry, Andry will offer a presentation on Sunday, January 18th at 3:00pm. Pie and coffee will be served.
